SUBJECT: Crime Victims Services Commission Reorganization; Contact Information

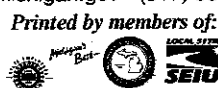
Greetings crime victim rights supporters. Earlier this year the Michigan Department of Community Health completed a reorganization initiative within the Health Policy and Regulations Administration. The primary focus was to achieve efficiencies by consolidating various legal and policy activities with the intent of strengthening our ability to protect, preserve and promote the health and safety of Michigan's citizens. A portion of that initiative involved the Crime Victims Services Commission. This reorganization does not impact upon the manner in which the Commission conducts its day to day business activities.

Since I am a new member of the Commission, I wanted to take this opportunity to introduce myself, and in addition convey to you the names of the contact persons for each of the units within the Commission. Even though the majority of you, through current and past interactions, are acquainted with these important resource personnel, I felt it important to provide this update to ensure that your requests and concerns are directed to, and addressed by, the appropriate staff members.

Over the past 35 years my energies in state government have been devoted to the emergency medical services and trauma program. With the retirement of Mr. Michael Fullwood, the prior manager of the Crime Victims Services Commission, I was asked to fill the position on an interim basis. With the implementation of the reorganization mentioned previously, I was appointed Director of the Crime Victims and Emergency Medical Services Division. This new environment has been a major turn within my career, but with the support of staff I am gaining more insights into the broad spectrum of crime victim services to our citizens. In addition I have come to more fully appreciate the services we collaboratively provide. I look forward to doing all I can to maintain our important role in helping those who experience the trauma of criminal activity.

**Victim Compensation**

Compensation - Provides financial assistance to victims who are personally physically injured as a result of a crime resulting in medical bills, loss of earnings, burial, or counseling and rehabilitative needs. Since victim compensation is a payor of last resort, it is required that the victim cooperate with police in their investigation.

SAFE Response - Provides payment for a sexual assault medical forensic examination based upon current law.
